"Life Abundant" Small Group Bible Study

Are you looking for an opportunity to grow deeper in faith, experience the support of Christian community, experience new forms of spirituality, and grow as a disciple and follower of Christ? If so, "Life Abundant" may be just right for you.

This winter we are replacing our Tuesday night Bible Study with a small group study we are calling "Life Abundant." Pastor Yvette and Pastor Brian will each lead a small group, and more will be formed as needed. These groups will meet at 7 p.m. twice a month on Tuesday nights. There will also be a group for young adults meeting twice a month on Sunday mornings at 9:30 a.m. If there is interest, we may also form groups that meet at other times.



Each group will be limited to 8 people, and each session will include:

- 1) Time to check in with each other about how we are doing.
- 2) Discussion of a reading in spirituality which will be handed out ahead of time.
- 3) Prayer and Focus on ways to live out our discipleship of Jesus.

Once a group is formed, they will decide among themselves the exact dates on which they will meet, including whether to meet at church or in private homes. It is important that all group members be present as often as possible.

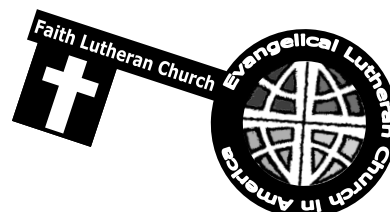

Mission of the Month: Arlington Free Clinic

The Arlington Free Clinic (AFC) provides free, high-quality medical care to low-income, uninsured Arlington County adults through the generosity of donors and volunteers. All patients live in Arlington County and have incomes at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level. Although most of their patients work, their jobs do not include access to health insurance. In recent years, an increasing number of new patients came to the AFC after losing their jobs and their insurance.



There are two ways to become an AFC patient. One, each month, they accept approximately 25 new patients through a lottery process. Two, individuals referred by Virginia Hospital Center, the Arlington County Department of Human Resources, and shelters that meet eligibility requirements are directly accepted. These include the sickest patients, such as those with cancer, uncontrolled diabetes, and renal failure.

During AFC's fiscal year 2014, it: (1) provided 9,106 medical visits for 1,756 individual patients; (2) brought in 430 Arlington residents who previously did not have regular access to medical care; and (3) had 640 volunteers who provided over 18,180 hours of services (service valued at over a million dollars).

A small percentage of AFC patients are now able to purchase affordable health coverage. Throughout 2014, AFC partnered with local organizations to provide Health Insurance Marketplace counseling for patients. Over 100 patients enrolled in insurance plans and are making the transition to their new medical providers, fully equipped with their medical histories and medication lists. As those who are eligible for insurance leave AFC, they are able to bring in more low-income Arlingtonians who continue to lack options for affordable health care.

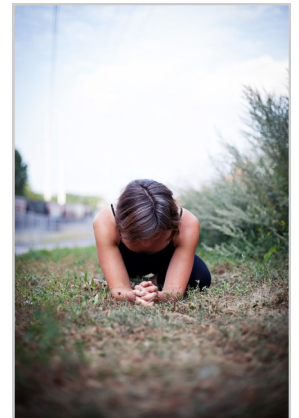

Creation Care: Resolve to Save on Heating Bills

It's that time of year when people make resolutions for the New Year. How about trying to spend less on your heating bills this winter? To help save you some money, here are a few quick, easy, and low cost ways to help lower your heating bills as the winter goes along.

- **Reverse ceiling fans.** Running the fans counterclockwise makes it cooler during the summer months. Reverse them to run clockwise, and they will circulate the warm air back into the room. There is a switch on the side of the ceiling fan that will change the direction of the fan. This also helps circulate the air in each room and from room to room.
- **Install inserts behind electrical outlet cover plates.** Foam cutouts can be inserted behind the cover plates of electrical outlets to reduce the amount of cold air entering a room. These inserts will make the biggest difference on the exterior walls of each room. Outlets on walls that have a room on the other side of the wall do not need an insert. If you take a cover plate off, you will probably feel the cold air coming through the outlet into the room. A pack of 14 electrical outlet covers costs less than \$3.00 at Home Depot and the only tool you will need a flat head screwdriver to take the cover plate off.
- **Put down area rugs on tile and wood floors.** It creates a layer of DIY insulation, plus makes it more comfortable to walk on in bare feet.
- **Install draft stops at doors.** While most exterior doors have weather-stripping installed to keep the outside air from getting into a building, interior doors do not. The ideal place to install a draft stop inside your house is for doors going to basements. Your basement is usually much cooler than the rest of the house in the winter and the gap between the door and the floor will allow the cool air to get into other rooms. A draft stop would also be useful for a walk-in attic. Draft stop kits can be bought at major retailers and home improvement stores and cost as little as \$10. Installation is simple and should not take long to do.

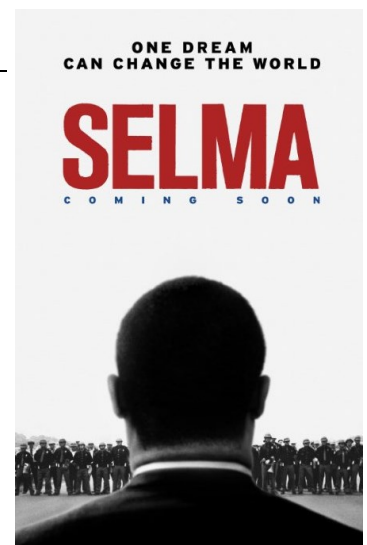

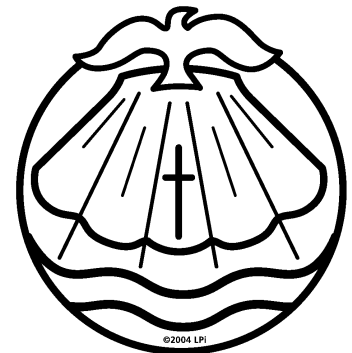


Celebrate with Flowers!
