In support of a young growing family, a Stephen Minister can be there after the baby arrives, demanding more than ever imagined; or after the pink slip arrives in the envelope with a final paycheck; or after the family has heard about worries one too many times. A Stephen Minister can be there to provide encouragement and comfort.

## Who Was Jesus, Anyway?

*Meeting Jesus Again:* This is the theme of a 12-week Bible Study, meeting on twelve Tuesday evenings from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. this fall.

Marcus Borg wrote a fascinating book a few years ago entitled *Meeting Jesus Again for the Second Time*. As a Sunday School student growing up in the church (in North Dakota, by the way) he was taught a certain view of Jesus. Then, as an adult scholar, he went back to the Bible to try to look in a fresh way at what the Bible actually teaches us about Jesus.

Our Bible study this fall will do the same thing. Using curriculum from the same folks who brought us the *Living the Questions* series this past year, we will study *Saving Jesus Redux*. This 12-week series is built around a 30 minute video and encourages lively discussion about who Jesus was and what he means for us today.

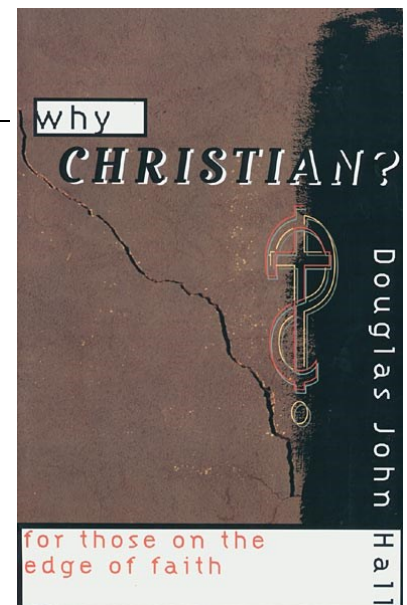
September 14: "Why Jesus?"

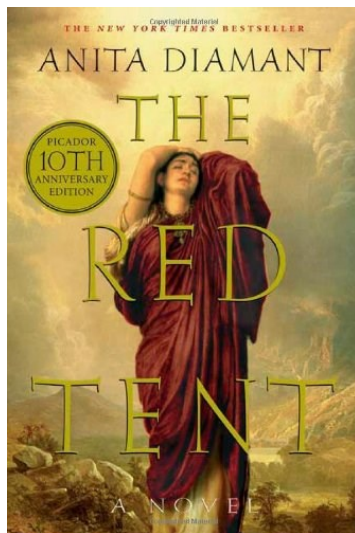
## Your Dream Job Awaits!

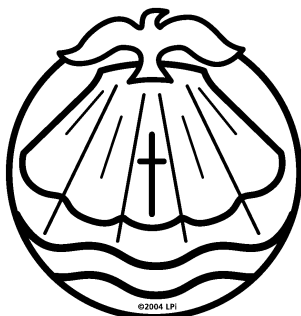

## Mission of the Month: Village of Hope Lazarus Project

The Village of Hope Lazarus Project is the grassroots effort of an ever-growing number of individuals and congregations who want to serve in ministry in Haiti. Village of Hope Lazarus Project provides financial support to ministries in Haiti as well as opportunities for short term mission teams to serve those ministries.

### Health Center

The newest ministry of VoH, the Health Center has been open since April of 2012 and continues to thrive. The Health Center serves the students and staff at the VoH School and the people living in the Galette Chambon and Balan Community Sections, by providing the best possible physical, emotional and spiritual care for each of the patients and their families. This includes vaccination and nutrition programs, pre-natal health care and community education programs for patients with diabetes and hypertension.

### VOH School Sponsorship Program

The VoH School provides quality education, in a Christian-based environment to over 600 children from kindergarten through high school. The students attend Chapel once a week, and services for the senior classes are led by high school students. Each day students receive a meal of rice and beans.



### How You Can Help

#### *Sponsor a Child Attending the Village of Hope School*

Sponsoring a student is a distinctive and personal way to enhance and develop the life of a vulnerable child. Supporting a child's education is like planting a mango tree: one does not benefit from it for some years, but one day the flowers appear and the next, the fruit for all to enjoy. The funds provided through sponsorships support the costs for the child's attendance at the school, such as text books, school supplies, a daily meal, vitamins and medical care. Full sponsorships are \$420 per year.

It is a facility of Food for The Poor that receives supplemental income from The Lazarus Project. LCJ provides food, clothing, shelter, medical care and love to over 100 children with special needs. The facility has a school area and a teacher that provides basic education to the children that are well enough to participate. Children, whose cognitive ability is not compromised by their disability, attend a local school. A physical therapist provides massage and therapy to promote improved strength, range of motion and improved motor skills.
